BOMA CDM doubles incentives!

The Building Owners and Managers Association (BOMA) of Toronto Conservation Demand Management (CDM) program has doubled incentives for all non-lighting projects. Effective immediately, the BOMA CDM incentive rates are \$800. per kilowatt (kW) of on-peak demand savings or \$0.10 per kilowatt-hour (kWh) annual consumption savings for all non-lighting projects.. The incentive remains capped at 40% of the total eligible project costs. This increase has huge implications for building owners considering energy efficiency projects, both small and large. **Energy@Work** has executed many incentive applications. Real Time Monitoring (RTM) continues to provide operators with energy management

While not comparable to the \$1.89 per kWh price spike of February 18th, on October 6th and October 7th 2009, the Hourly Ontario Energy Price (HOEP) experienced two hourly price spikes that were up to 7 times the average hourly price for the day. RTM becomes a required tool for operators and management with the ability to set alarms and be notified if the price exceeds a preset threshold.
